Q--I'm doing research on different kind of biog. of W.v.B & I know you 2 were very well acquainted.

IML -- I considered him a good friend.

Q--Apparently it was mutual. Am doing an anecdotal biog. on v.B. the man, th person, looking beyond just "the rocket genius," into his personality, his life's interests outside his work. Ran across a letter you had written him on his 60th b'day, in '72. I'd like to excerpt from tht letter.

IML -- Do you hav th letter w/ you? I'd like you to read it to me.

(I read letter verbatim to him)

Q--I just love th way you have tied together that progression of advances in the fields of astronomy & space travel, & wd. like to use that in th book.

IML--(sd. lost many of his files in move from Franklin Inst. To work for Mayor Frank Rizzo at Phila. City Hall. Doesn't hav letter; asked me to send him copy, WHICH I WILL DO)

Wernher had made a presentation to me. Some group ... said who wd you like to make th pre. & I sd w.v.B. So they wrote him a letter, & Bart Slattery, who was his P.R. man, wrote

Franklin
Franklin Institute. And so when the German Society (of Penn.) asked me to do it, I sd I'd be delighted to, and of course I did.

But before I made tht formal presentation, if you'll bear w/ me, I will tell you a little story: I was Dir. of th Planetarium. There I afternoon was a workman behind th perforated dome. Th workman entered th door tht was due west. And in th afternoon, tht was th dir'n of th setting sun.

Well, th lecture started promptly at 3 pm, but at qtr. to 3 a (the?) workman got out, closed door, sat down. Lecture started at 3, normally ran 40-45 mins. At 45 mins. later, th workman opened th door. And there, silhouetted in th bright afternoon, was this man. And a hush fell over th audience. The lecturer was stunned. And finally, a little voice piped up from the eastern side and sd, "Mommy, I just saw God!" When I started this story I had said I'm very,

- Q-- Let me ask you abt a sensitive matter, not something I plan to dwell on. In course of my research, seems tht no. of prominent people of Jewish faith were friends of v.B. Apparently they worked thru his connection w/ horrible 3rd Reich & got to the man, and apparently seen tht he didnt carry tht prejudicial baggage personally.

th SS, for job assignment or for whatever, he had to hav th rank to enforce what his decisions were. That is why Himmler gave him that rank, so that he could continue his work.

Q--I had never heard that. Very Interesting. Did you & he ever discuss that? Or that period, & how he felt abt Hitler? **Ladarcher** IML--Yeah.

Q--I do have a no. of his comments abt (Hitler)--

IML- Was You may know th oft-repeated story tht he was picked up by th SS & they even sd he was to be executed bec he was not putting all of his effort into th Revenge weapons but he was talking space travel. And for tht he was arrested, & only th intervention of Dornberger, who was th commandant of Peen.--

a very nasty fate.

Q--I do hav fair amt of info abt that. But I do think it's interesting tht you were friends & colleagues in th world of science.

IML--Let's go back to 1954. In 1952 I gave a paper to th Signal Corps talking abt an inflatable balloon satellite. I wanted to take a balloon & blow it up & put a carbon dioxide cartridge in it. And when it got into Earth orbit, th carbon dioxide cartridge wd fill th balloon. But th balloon was to be covered w/ aluminum foil. Now, once you've got it in orbit, there are no forces acting on it. So if the baloon was blown up (inflated) & th aluminum was stratched to th configuration of th balloon, it wouldn't shrink, simply bec there are no forces acting on it.

And so I gave a paper in Innsbruck on the geodetic significance of a minimum satellite. I first gav it to th Signal

Corps & suggested then ... and the papers wrote it up, and we had an editorial saying that 'bargain basement balloons (?) (boons?) are not necessary & not wanted'. Therewere the bit of a ribbing there.

But my first meeting w him (v.B) was in '52 but I met him again in '54 in Innsbruck. I presented th paper (again), and I hav a copy of th paper in my files. In 1958 Explorer I went up That was Jan. 31st, something like that? I got a call from v. Braun. He said, "Vell, come down to Hsv. I want to talk to you." And so I came down, and he said, "Ve vant to make the last stage visible." This was only a cannister, abt 5 in. in dia maybe & 5 or 6 ft tall, w/ very stringent wt. limits. And so he says, "Will you do it?" And I sd, "Sure!." I sd, "If I can get the Franklin Institute Research Laboratories to help me." So I walked away w/ a \$30,000 contract for th Franklin Inst. to make this satellite visible, bec of the Sputniks, which were visible, as you will recall. We had a very, very good idea. I was going to take a lot of tubular balloons -- the ones that th magicians use to make little animals out offor th kids. I was going to take a batch of those & line them up vertically along th long axis of the satellite, and when it got into orbit they wd open up & be inflated again by a CO2 cartridge. They wd be aluminum coated, hoping that that wd be a way they cd be seen from th surface of th Earth. Unfortunately, th wt limitations which they imposed made it impossible to add tht kind of wt. to it, and so th project just couldn't be consummated, that was all. So, here was von B, Yolding my previous papers on an in-/building on

flatable balloon satellite--which, incidentally, was launched as Project Echo ... and an engineer down at Wallops Is. (Va.) took \$5000 for the idea!

Q-- Oh, is that right?

IML--That's right. He read my paper. But anyway, I thought this was another angle of von B where he figured, fine, he came up w/ this idea of an inflatable balloon satellite which could be seen -- why cant he help my Explorer? And that's why he had me down (to Hsv.) ... And then, oc course, in a couple more mos. we started putting satellites up w/o th necessity of being visible. We were involved in th space game for real.

Q--What do you recall as v.Braun's most outstanding personal qualities? IML--He was a commanding figure. He was th type that, when he walked in th room, the conversation would stop and eyes would turn torward his entrance. He was a commanding figure, at least to me he was, probably bec I was so young, I guess--and

of course I met him when I was quite young. And *** think that this was th man who put th V-2s up-- I won't say he sits on th right hand side of God, but he's someone big. He had a commanding presence, and also he was very, very bright--so very, very bright.

Q--And, as opposed to Robt Goddard, he was so gregarious.

INL -- Robt Goddard was an introvert.

Q--And thereby hangs part of the tale, doesn't it? IML--Yep.

Q--Von Braun was so That Goddard was so stung by th criticism he got q early on, that, the doubting thomases he got & th ridicule, that he turned was more inward.

IML--He turned inward. And that was th opposite of von B, who was very outgoing. He would take information, he would tap knowledge no matter where he found it, & would enter into extensive conversations. He was ... like my wife: She 'visits' people. In th supermkt this morn., she "visited" w/ one woman, she "visited" w/ th cashier. I just stand there & stew. I want to get th hell out.

Q--von Braun loved to talk. IML--Right.
