Q. Dahm's feelings when learned v. B was leaving Hsv for Wash. ??

A--I was sad to see him leave. He was the one boss that I (trust?)
E. Rees' remaining in command "still gave some continuity."
Q--Get any feedback on how v.B was doing in Wash. those 2 yrs.?
A--Well, I heard that it had become a step back, that he got no support. And I also heard that this whole thing had been a political arrangement. As Center director, he was unassailable. In Washington, he took a step back. There were people who were tired of being in his shadow, and

they had arranged this."

Q--Tom Paine issued th invitation to v.B to come to Wash., or it was a command.

A--It was an invitation. He couldn't command him.
